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1.- PRESENTATION

In accordance with the Royal Decree 1393/2007, 29th October, in which the planning of the official university teaching is established, modified by the Royal Decree 861/2010, 2nd July, the official University Degree teaching will conclude with the development and presentation of a Final Degree Project, which has a mandatory character and which the student must do at the end of his academic Degree (8th semester), this being oriented to the assessment of competences associated to the Degree.

The duration of the TFG and therefore, the students' dedication on it, will be of 6 credits.

According to what is described in the TFG guidelines in CES Don Bosco (check: http://www.cesdonbosco.com/documentos/Normativa_TFG.pdf), the TFG is an original and autonomous academic work which each student will develop individually under the tutelage of a professor from CES Don Bosco who will act as an academic tutor of the student. The TFG contents will depend on the chosen topic, advised by the tutor teacher of the student, although, in general, the project will have a flexible, open,



interdisciplinary, global...character, taking into account that it must allow to show the level of command of the general and cross curricular competences of the Degree.

2.- LEARNING OUTCOMES

The student will show he has acquired in an integrated way the competences and formative contents linked to the Degree curriculum. The acquisition is restricted to the following learning outcomes:

- Command of the development of the academic paper in formal aspects as well as in structuring and content.
- Capacity of creativity in the choice, treatment, development and presentation of the topic.
- Level of reflexive, analytic, synthetic and critical thinking development.
- Command of the oral and written communication skills.
- Sound command in TICs.
- Mastery of the basic knowledge in which the student's professional know how is based in the different fields in which it is developed.
- Mastery of the didactic strategies applied to the teaching and learning processes and to the different disciplinary areas in educative and formative contexts.

4.- CONTENT PROGRAM

The TFG contents will depend on the chosen topic, advised by the tutor teacher of the student. The working lines for the course in the Early Childhood Education Degree are the following:

1. Experiences and educative practices in different countries.
2. Trip around the world in a project: Geography and interculturality in Infant Education.
3. The role of literature (stories, poetry and drama) in the teaching of English in Primary Education.



4. The development of the communicative competence in the English classroom in Early Childhood Education.
5. Use of games and ludic materials in the teaching of English in Early Childhood Education.
6. Classroom management in the English Class.
7. Creativity at school and through Pinterest network.

5.- TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The formative activities will revolve around the development of the project and will be articulated around the following methodologies:

1. **Big group seminars on the TFG:** in this formative activity, of general character, students will be presented with the sense, characteristics and structure of the Final Degree Project (0.5 ECTS, 8.33%).
2. **Group and individual academic tutorials:** in which the student will meet his tutor for enquiries, advice and follow up of the work. In these, relevant information may be interchanged for a correct development of the TFG (0.75 ECTS, 12.5%).
3. **Student's autonomous work:** in this period, searching of information activities will be developed through different sources, bibliographic analysis, field work, application of instruments (questionnaires, scales, etc.), interviews, meetings, structuring of the project, drafting, etc., managing the TICs as one of the fundamental resources to show evidences of achievement of this cross curricular competence (4.5 ECTS, 75%).
4. **Oral presentation of the TFG:** presentation and oral defense in the presence of the assessment Committee (0.25 ECTS, 4.16%).

The tutor will specify the methodological technique to be applied in each TFG.

6.- ASSESSMENT

6.1.- ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

The Practicum is graded according to the article five of Royal Decree 1125/2003 (<https://www.boe.es/buscar/pdf/2003/BOE-A-2003-17643-consolidado.pdf>). The grading system is based on the numerical scale of 0 to 10, with expression of a decimal, to which is added the corresponding qualitative grade: 0 – 4 Fail (F); 5.0 - 6.9: Pass (P); 7.0 - 8.9: Very Good (VG); 9.0 - 10: Excellent (E); 10: Outstanding (O).

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6.3.- Assessment Criteria

In order to have the final grade passed, it is necessary to reach at least 50% of the maximum score in each of the evaluation techniques. Every work will need to adjust to the criteria introduced in the magazine nº 33 "Educación y Futuro" (http://cesdonbosco.com/documentos/revistaeyf/EYF_33.pdf).

Plagiarism in the TFG, whether totally or partially will result in losing the call of the course.

Students of the extraordinary call in February will be driven by a calendar adjusted to such call (according to the timeline published in the guide). If not exceeded, students will have another call in the course 2019/20 to be chosen by the student (June or July) adjusting its development to the established calendar for these calls.

The tutor of the TFG will not validate any work containing spelling mistakes.

The student evaluation process will be verified through an evaluation rubric in which the tutor will reflect the score given to the student in its formative and summative evaluation. On the other side, the tribunal will use another evaluation rubric where they will reflect the score given to the defense.

In the bilingual modality, the TFG can be done in English as a whole or, at least, the abstract and the theoretical framework. The rest of the sections could also be done in English depending on the agreement with the tutor. The defense will be carried out entirely in English according to the disposed in point 8.3 of the TFG normative.
