

6.3.- Criterios de Evaluación

GENERALES:

- Para obtener la nota final aprobada, es necesario alcanzar al menos el 50% de la puntuación máxima en cada una de las técnicas de evaluación.
- Para la cita y referencia de fuentes de información de los trabajos académicos, los alumnos deben seguir las recomendaciones de las normas APA 7^a ed.
- El plagio en los trabajos y los intentos de engaño en los exámenes supondrá para el alumno la pérdida de la convocatoria en curso.
- Errores ortográficos en todas las técnicas de evaluación. En esta asignatura se concretan de la siguiente manera:

- Tasks that have been handed in past the deadline will not be assessed.

-The plagiarism in the assignments and the attempts of cheating in the exams will entail a fail mark in the current call.

- To pass every type of evaluation techniques, a minimum of 5 out of 10 must be obtained.

- The marks/activities already passed in the 1st call are kept for the July call.

CRITERIOS PARA 2^a CONVOCATORIA

The attendance is not compulsory, but the students will have their grades in presentations only if they come to class that day.

Students who fail the subject will have to take a written test in July that will collect all the parts of the subject. The marks/activities already passed in the 1st call are kept for the July call.

If a student is taking the subject the following year after failing it the previous course, they need to take an exam and do a final-project.

Examination of the material uploaded to the platform (70% of the grade).

Final project (30% of the grade). Students must pass both exam and final project.



This consists of the creation of a micro-teaching that lasts between 7 and 10 minutes. It must include a description of the group, center, objectives, materials, and timing.

It is focused on the teaching of poetry to elementary school children. The content may change depending on the circumstances.

It must start with a brief warm-up at the beginning, your poem and the activities. The student will record him/herself IN ENGLISH so that your level of spoken English is assessed by presenting the activity.

In your presentation you do not have to read or say the description of the activity, this can be presented on a separate sheet. In the presentation you must address to the camera as if it was a student and explain how it will work with this poem. You can send it to my email directly or through the website WeTransfer.

Should be perfectly adequate to the level of the course you have chosen.

ALUMNOS DE SEGUNDAS Y SUCEIVAS MATRÍCULAS

One of the language skills that is assessed in Bilingual coursework is language accuracy and control - what can also be described as "correctness".

Although some errors may not affect exam marks significantly, systematic repetition of basic errors will be sanctioned lowering the final grade. If the mistakes in English show an evident lack of proficiency in writing the student may fail the exam.

Students will have to read a book in English every term. They will read it at home, but we will comment on the book in class, mentioning vocabulary or expressions that students don't know and will enrich their level of English. Students will have to answer one or two questions about the book in the exam, as well as being asked about the vocabulary/ expressions mentioned in class. The book is a compulsory part of the module.
